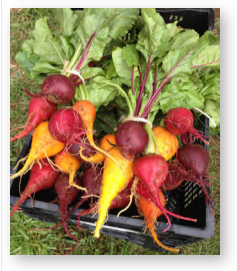

School Lunch Farm & CSA is a **100% Certified Organic and GMO-Free Farm** offering a weekly share of organic produce for 15 weeks. Your share is harvested the day you pick it up — so your veggies are super fresh. We grow over 200 varieties of organic vegetables, fruit, herbs, and flowers, with 10-18 types of produce available on any given week. All of our produce is grown from seed to harvest on our farm. We do not purchase produce from other farms or food distributors. Shareholders are welcome to volunteer at the farm, hike our woods, and participate in our educational programs.



Community Supported Agriculture Program (CSA)

By joining our CSA, you are supporting local food security, food quality, and earth-friendly farming practices. CSA shareholders pay for shares in advance, enabling the farmer to buy the necessary seeds and equipment and carefully plan for the upcoming season. This results in greater efficiency and less waste.

What is a CSA...

In basic terms, CSA consists of a community of individuals who pledge support to a farm operation so that the farmland becomes the community's farm, with the growers and consumers providing mutual support and sharing the risks and benefits of food production. Typically, members or "share-holders" of the farm pledge in advance their share payment to cover the anticipated costs of the farm operation. In return, they receive shares in the farm's bounty throughout the growing season, as well as satisfaction gained from reconnecting to the land.

CSA farmers typically use organic farming methods, and strive to provide fresh, high-quality foods. Most CSAs offer a diversity of vegetables, fruits, and herbs in season; most provide a full array of farm produce.



Educating children about healthy food

School Lunch Organic Farm hosts a variety of programs to educate children and adults about healthy eating, sustainable agriculture, and the natural world. Community, school, and scouting groups can use the rich resources of the farm to extend their members' learning beyond the classroom and kitchen.



Feeding those in need
